Karten Print Shop are very excited to announce that they have secured funding from Karten Network. A total of £25,000 has been awarded which will fund a new

production level printer and folding machine. Students within Retail Studies will benefit from this funding enabling them to continue to work at industry standard levels. The Karten Network is a network of IT centres for disabled people. The centres are funded through the lan Karten Charitable Trust, with the purpose of improving the quality of life and independence of adult people with congenital or acquired physical, cognitive, sensory, learning disabilities or mental health problems. The Karten Centres provide a supportive learning environment together with access to the latest in adaptive computer technology, and are located in a wide range of host organisations.
