
What's been happening in HOSPITALITY & GATERING STUDIES

Both Derwen and NSC students benefit from working collaboratively and sharing each other's knowledge and skills.

Inclusive Skills Competitions are run by Natspec in partnership with the Association of Colleges, and supported by WorldSkills UK, and enable young people with learning difficulties and disabilities to showcase their work skills and growing independence.


