# 'Journey'

# About the competition

Students from mainstream and specialist colleges and schools are invited to take part in an exciting new competition and art exhibition hosted by Derwen College.

# Entry Requirements

Student artists aged 16-25 working at up to Functional Skills **Entry Level 3** are welcome to enter the competition.

#### **Categories**

Entries are welcome in the following three categories:

- 2D all wall hung work (max. size A2)
- 3D all plinth standing (max. base size A4)
- Digital media all wall hung work (max. size A2)

#### All artwork must be signed by the student artist

## Competition timeline

### **Application Deadline:**

- Online applications for entering the competition must be submitted by: Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July 2019
- No artwork to be submitted at this stage

#### First Round Judging:

- Deadline for submitting first round digital entries is Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2019
- All first round entries should be <u>photographs of work only</u> and sent to skillslive@derwen.ac.uk as a **jpg** image **under 5MB**.
- Only one piece of art per entrant will be accepted
- No original artwork to be sent at this stage
- Please remember to indicate on your email, the name of the artist.
- Entrants will be notified by the end of September 2019 if they have been successful in progressing onto the second round

#### Second Round Judging:

 All shortlisted artwork will go forward to the second round and the original artwork will be required by Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2019

#### The Award

- Shortlisted artwork will go on public display at Derwen College 21<sup>st</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> October 2019
- Winners will be announced on the afternoon of Friday 25<sup>th</sup> October 2019

Each entry will receive a certificate of achievement.

## Competition Activity

### Theme: 'Journey'

Student artists are invited to take inspiration from their own personal Journey.

The artwork could lead each student to identify a journey important to them, and study / plan / experiment how to express it best through any medium included in the brief.

Sources of inspiration could, but not exclusively, be taken from:

- 'Journeys through life' series of images such as Hogarth's 'Rake's Progress' or 'Marriage a la Mode' document journeys
- A personal development, overcoming something personal, journey into adulthood, a time line
- An actual journey, either imaginary which could include space time and aspirational travel, or a physical journey experience from a bus ride to experiencing something extraordinary
- Pictorial maps –artist who uses maps

## Marking and Assessment

### **Marking Criteria:**

A maximum of 20 marks will be awarded for each of the following:

- Originality of idea
- Use of colour
- Use of materials
- Overall composition
- Presentation

### The Judges

An independent panel made up of representatives from local and national art galleries will judge artwork.

## Competition Rules

- Student artists working at up to functional skills Entry Level 3 are welcome to enter the competition
- Student artists must be aged 16-25
- Each entry must be the student's own work
- Student artists must only enter one piece of artwork
- No group work will be accepted
- Please include a statement of support that outlines any individual needs of the learner within the competition, i.e.: support with communication etc.
